

How to open Links in the Study Guide

Left click your mouse to open.

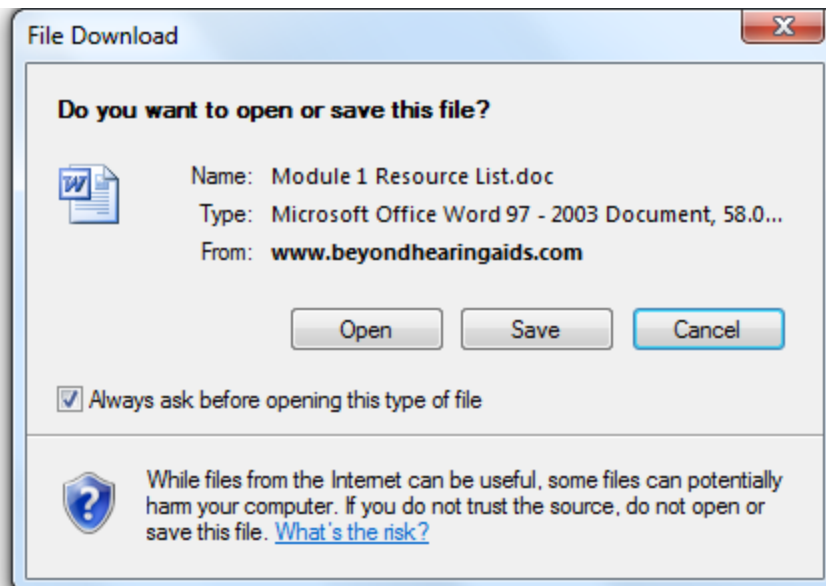


